A Workshop with the Prague Conservatory and Musical Tour of Central Europe

Power up your music studies with a four week pre-university workshop and exciting tour! Open to band, orchestra or vocal high school students who are serious about improving their musical ability and gaining insight into the history of Western music.

During the workshop in Prague, you will:

- Build your performance skills with 2 to 3 private lessons at the Prague Conservatory. All teachers are highly experienced and most perform as professional musicians.
- Rehearse the music from your private lesson in the conservatory's practice rooms. A music professor from ArtsAbroad will be available for extra help.
- Participate in group masterclasses or small ensembles, depending on the instrumentation of participants.
- Engage in discussions and lectures as you prepare for university studies. This will include basic music theory and history topics, as well as a special Czech music lecture.
- Perform the works you have learned in a recital at one of Prague's beautiful music halls at the workshop's conclusion.

- 10 day Prague Conservatory Workshop including all lectures and 2-3 private lessons
- Lectures at important music history sites throughout Central Europe
- Entrance fees into many major tourist sights
- Tickets to 4 professional concerts
- Tickets to the Munich Opera Festival

Prague, Czech Republic

One of Europe's most beautiful cities with castles, magnificent churches, and music at every turn. Learn about the works of Smetana, Dvorak, Janacek and even Mozart. We will also visit nearby Terezin Concentration Camp, a place with a special musical history.

Vienna, Austria

It would be difficult to find a more musical place than Vienna. With grand palaces, performance halls, opera houses and museums, it is a breath-taking city. Attend concerts and lectures about the greats who lived here - Beethoven, Mozart, Haydn, Strauss, and Schoenberg.



Salzburg, Austria

Mozart's birthplace provides history and concerts in honor of the prodigy. The city is one of the most scenic in Europe, with a magical castle. A relaxing day will be spent at a nearby Alpine lake.

Munich, Germany

Enjoy a night in one of the world's most beautiful opera houses for the Munich Opera Festival's performance of *Fidelio*. A tour will prove there is much more to this huge city than *Oktoberfest*, with beautiful architecture, great art museums, and of course, oompah bands.

Leipzig, Germany

Visit the church where the great J.S. Bach played his masterpieces. Lectures on other prominent composers of the city - Schumann, Wagner, Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, Telemann, Weber, and Mahler. Free time for luxury shopping at one of the world's largest train stations!

Dresden, Germany

Here you will find a Baroque gem that was rebuilt after WWII destruction. See the famous *Semperoper*, where one of the world's oldest orchestras and opera company performs, and where many of Wagner's and Strauss' works debuted. Also learn more about lesser-known composers Heinrich Schütz and Johann Adolf Hasse.
